#### **Competition Information**

This competition will consist of three phases, the winners being those with the highest points accumulated across the three phases, to a possible maximum of 460 points.

Competitors can expect to be riding across varied terrain, which will include quiet country roads, tracks, and paths. Competitors may also be riding through fields of livestock, please use your common sense when riding past these animals. All landowners have been very supportive and we have managed to gain access to some off-road riding. We must stress the need to keep gates closed and to ensure that you follow the Country Code. If you find a gate closed, please close it again behind you.

#### Insurance

A rider may be held liable for damages, where they are found to have negligently caused injury to persons or livestock and/or damage to property and where TREC Ireland and/or the landowner are shown not to have been negligent. Riders should therefore be aware of the limits for TREC Ireland's insurance cover (and that of any other equestrian sport organisation).

Some landowners may specifically ask that riders have their own insurance cover before they give permission to ride through their lands. Therefore, at our event, each rider must provide evidence of adequate cover for themselves and for their horse, either fully paid BHS Gold Membership or equivalent insurance.

All entries must be pre-paid and sent in on the Entry form (page 7 and 8). **The closing date for entries is Monday June 11**<sup>th</sup> **2018.** 

♦ Refund for Cancellations – As certain organisational costs are fixed, refunds can only be given in full if an entry is cancelled prior to the closing date for entries (Monday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2018).

#### Code of Ethics

TREC Ireland's 'Code of Ethics & Good Practice for Children's Sport' will be adhered to for this event, and can be downloaded from www.trecireland.com Please note:

- ♦ Parents and participants must fill in the entry form with the understanding that they 'agree to abide by TREC Ireland's code of ethics and good practice' this also allows West Cork TREC and TREC Ireland to include the photos of the junior participants on the internet and any newspapers such as the Irish Field.
- Parents must ensure that a 'Junior Participants Form' is submitted for any participant (competitor or helper) who is under 18. All junior participants should be accompanied either by an adult family member or two supervising adults.
- Anybody involved in any way with the event on any or all of the days must sign in using the provided sign-in sheet (in the Event Secretary's Office/Tent).

#### **Junior Competitors**

All junior competitors (under 18 years) must send in a **Junior Participant's Form** with their entry (see page 9). *For the POR phase:* 

- ♦ A young rider may ride as an individual if they are 16 years old in the *calendar year* of the competition (i.e. the rider will be 16 on or before 31.12.18).
- Any rider under this age limit must be accompanied by an adult (over 18) in the pair classes.
  Please note West Cork TREC will not take responsibility for pairing an under 16 rider, they must enter as a pair with an adult rider.

#### **Volunteers**

All TREC competitions rely on the support of volunteer judges and helpers. If there is anyone who can come along and help, please complete the Volunteer form on page 10 and email it to our event secretary by 11<sup>th</sup> June 2018.

We are seeking volunteers with experience for the tasks of checkpoint stewards, and judging the MA or PTV obstacles. We welcome volunteers that might not have any experience or who do not want to judge as there are many other tasks that are involved in running a competition like this, such as setting up and putting away the equipment, calling riders to start of course, holding horses while competitors are in the map room, timing stewards, etc. We are grateful for all offers of help and you will learn lots from the inside! Even a couple of hours help can make a big difference to the smooth running of the competition.

Riders, if you are able to help for any tasks on any of the days, please complete the Volunteer form on page 10 and send it in with your entry. You may be able to help setup on Friday, or dismantle and pack away on Sunday, or you might have decided to enter the competition for just one day only and can help out on the other day.

#### Food

Riders are expected to bring their own lunch/snacks for Saturday and Sunday, or they may order a filled roll for one or both of the days (€3 each) when completing their order form. A filled roll will be provided free of charge to all helpers on both Saturday and Sunday. We will provide bottles of water for riders and helpers on both days and there is access to a facility on site where people can make tea/coffee.

There will be a Social Evening Meal at a venue nearby on Saturday evening. Tickets to the Social Evening Meal will cost €15 per person. Riders may order extra tickets for friends or partners etc. The rider must record the total number of tickets (including their own) being ordered and price on the entry form in the space provided. Helpers who are volunteering **both days** will receive a ticket for the social evening free of charge. (Helpers requiring extra tickets should contact the event secretary to order tickets and organise payment of same).

Please indicate in the entry form (or helper form) if you have any special dietary requirements. You may bring your own lunch/snacks if you would prefer to do so (recommended if your dietary needs are complex).

#### Equipment

Please refer to TREC Ireland Rule Book for a list of all the mandatory and any additional equipment required for the different phases. (A copy of the list can be found in an appendix at the end of this document for your convenience).

- ♦ Body Protectors: All riders under 18 must wear a body protector (Beta Level 3 standard) for the PTV phase of the competition.
- Riding hats: Riding hats must conform to the safety standards outlined in the current TREC Ireland Rule Book.
- Level 1 POR concession: A special concession was introduced by TREC Ireland which allows Level 1 riders to
  participate in local competitions with a slightly reduced equipment list; the minimum items required are clearly
  marked in our appendix.

#### Registration of Equine Premises

Include your equine premises number on the entry form. If you have not yet registered your equine premises, you can obtain information and registration form at www.agriculture.gov.ie/animalhealthwelfare/animalwelfare. The registration takes approximately 2-3 weeks, and there is no fee to register. The reason for registering and record keeping is so as to enable the Department of Agriculture to have information on the location of horses and their contacts with other horses in order that in the event of a disease outbreak, owners can be identified and advised of any necessary precautions. TREC Ireland and West Cork TREC may be asked to provide a list of registration numbers for all horses/ponies that participated/attended the event. If you do not yet have a registration number at the time you are submitting your entry, you may submit your entry anyway and you will have the opportunity to provide your equine premises number on the day. If your application is still being processed at the time of the event you can still participate, but will be required to provide the number after the event.

#### **Passports**

It is a legal requirement to carry a passport when a horse is used for the purpose of competition. If a horse is transported without a passport when being used for competition purposes an offence is being committed and prosecution is a possibility. **Passports will be required at vetting/health check.** 

#### **Vetting/Health Check**

All horses/ponies will be vetted prior to the start of the competition, and will be presented for the vetting/health check in competition number order (a list of approximate times will be produced). The rider must present the horse in a bridle (recommended) or in a head collar in a clean tidy state with saddle and/or any protective boots removed. The vetting/health check will be carried out in accordance with TREC Ireland. Riders are required to familiarise themselves with these rules. This vetting/health check does not guarantee the good health of the horse and shall not engage the liability of the organisation.

Vetting prior to the POR phase will commence on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> June for all levels and prior to the MA phase on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> June. Only those competing both Saturday and Sunday are required to get their horses vetted on the Sunday.

#### **Vet / Farrier**

In case of emergencies, on call cover has been organised for the weekend with both a local farrier and a local veterinary practice who has a vet on call at the weekend. The organisers will have their numbers should there be a need to call for either service.

#### Rules / Breaching of Rules

The competition is organised according to TREC Ireland rules. Registration (through entry and/or sign in) means participants accept these rules. If breached, some rules (including those noted below) may result in a substantial amount of penalty points being applied to a rider's score or in some cases elimination from the phase or from the whole competition. It is the competitor's responsibility to be familiar with the current version of the TREC Ireland Rule Book, which is available to download from www.trecireland.com

- Outside assistance is NOT allowed in any phase of the competition
- POR: it is the responsibility of the competitor to collect their record card in the map room and retain it while out on the course.
- PTV: competitors must STOP and inform the relevant judge if they are not attempting an obstacle.

#### **Queries / Complaints**

Queries and complaints will be dealt with in accordance to TREC Ireland rules (section 3.8) and must be submitted within the relevant timeframes as outlined in this section.

- ♦ Competitors are not permitted to discuss timings or scores directly with the judges, but a competitor may ask a judge to record relevant observations.
- Queries All <u>queries</u> must be directed to the Technical Delegate within the allowed time (rule 3.8.2)
- ♦ Complaints All complaints must be lodged in writing with the Technical Delegate within the allowed time, no verbal complaints are admitted.

#### Directions to the venue (from the M8 Cork-Dublin motorway)

If travelling from the Cork end of the M8 motorway, you need to exit the motorway at Junction 18 (signposted R639 Glanmire). At the T-junction (150m), turn right towards Watergrasshill. At the roundabout (700m) take the first exit onto R639 towards Watergrasshill. After 800m turn right onto the L2972 signposted for Knockraha. Follow this road for 2.2km (ie under the bridge, continuing for approx. 1km then veering 90 degrees hard right followed by 90 degrees hard left, and continuing for about another 1km) until you reach a small road up to the left. Whooley's farm is a further 1.6km along this road at the end of the cul de sac.

If travelling from the Dublin end of the M8 motorway, you need to exit the motorway at Junction 18 (signposted R639 Glanmire). At the roundabout (500m), take the third exit (signposted R639 Glanmire). At the next roundabout (150m), take the second exit towards Watergrasshill R639. After 800m turn right onto the L2972 signposted for Knockraha. Follow this road for 2.2km (ie under the bridge, continuing for approx. 1km then veering 90 degrees hard right followed by 90 degrees hard left, and continuing for about another 1km) until you reach a small road up to the left. Whooley's farm is a further 1.6km along this road at the end of the cul de sac.

#### Corralling / Stabling
